
We hope you will visit the library this fall and attend our Open House on Friday, November 8th from 3 pm until 5 pm. I look forward to seeing you!

## Reading Recommendations

In anticipation of our author events to be offered by the Johann Fust Library Foundation this season, I have read three of the recently released books. I highly recommend each one—for completely different reasons.

The Viewing Room by Jacquelin Gorman, published by the University of Georgia Press. This book of linked stories has won the prestigious Flannery O'Connor Short Fiction Award for 2013. It has also been nominated for a National Book Award. I can promise you that you have never read anything like it. The stories, based upon "the viewing room" within a hospital where families of the deceased may gather to pay their last respects, are derived from the author's personal experience as a hospital chaplain. They are searing and poignant, full of wisdom and compassion, rising to literary heights only achieved by a consummate writer. Be prepared. They are sometimes painful, but always rewarding. Sparta by Roxana Robinson, published by Farrar, Straus, and Giroux. Anyone who has read Roxana Robinson's previous novels knows that her passion is fired by the vicissitudes of family life and relationships. What happens to one, happens to all. Divorce, aging, illness, drugs, and, now, in Sparta, the effects of PTSD. Her brilliant literary account of a Williams College classics scholar's journey into the horrors of the Iraq war and his return to American society is a well-researched, page-turning, suspenseful story. Being a Rockefeller, Becoming Myself, A Memoir by Eileen Rockefeller, published by Blue Rider Press. In the best contemporary memoirs, the author has a fascinating, meaningful story to tell and tells it through the intelligent eye of sustained reflection. Eileen Rockefeller, the youngest of Peggy and David Rockefeller's six children, has had her eye and her heart open for meaning from her earliest days. Her story is an uncommon insight into her remarkable family and a tribute to her own

courage, perseverance, curiosity, and artistic sensibilities. A delightful read! Community Center Auditorium—February 20th.

The mission of the Johann Fust Community Library is to serve as an intellectual and cultural center to enrich the lives of Boca Grande residents and visitors.

### Report from the Librarian . . .

Everyone is thrilled with our newly renovated library! From June 25th to September 30th 2,580 visitors have enjoyed our fabulous library spaces, garden and shell collection. Since the merger 78 people have signed up for their free library card. We have a total of 1482 library card holders. There have been 4,413 items checked out. We've hosted three popular I Pad user group sessions. Island School students, parents and teachers visited in August and September. They really enjoyed the library tour, scavenger hunt and book check out time. We have 15 library volunteers!

Our library system has more than one million items available. We deliver materials twice a week from Fort Myers. Here at Fust, we have more than 6,000 adult books, 3,000 children's books and 4,000 DVDs, audio books and music CDs for all ages. Every month we receive new materials. We have an inhouse *Island Picks* display of local recommendations and a local authors shelf.

The library never sleeps! At leelibrary.net you can download e-books, audio books, magazines, and music. You can access your library card to request and renew items. *Value Line* and *National Geographic* are two of the 140 subscription electronic resources free to library card holders. Our website boasts a total of 330 e-sources! We have 36 book suggestion e-newsletters. You can view them online or receive them monthly by email. You can reserve titles online, by calling us or visiting the library. Ask us for assistance, we love helping our customers navigate the digital world.
